ISO 17025 is a quality standard for testing and calibration laboratories. The current release was published in 2005. The need to gain ISO 17025 compliance and accreditation impacts many laboratories.

The contents of ISO 17025 standard itself comprise five elements that are Scope, Normative References, Terms and Definitions, Management Requirements and Technical Requirements. The two main sections in ISO 17025 are Management Requirements and Technical Requirements. Management requirements are primarily related to the operation and effectiveness of the quality management system within the laboratory. Technical requirements include factors which determine the correctness and reliability of the tests and calibrations performed in laboratory
